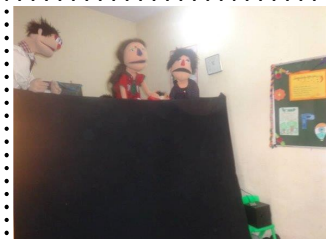

In IT twenty students participated in summer camp and they were taught movie making. Students enjoyed a lot while learning.



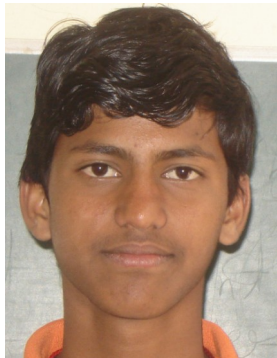
