### Launch of New Skill Centre and Self Help Group

CBSE Board results were declared for class 12th and 10<sup>th</sup> in July 2020, Our students did exceeding well. The highest score was 90% and 9 students out of 10 got above 60%. In class 10<sup>th</sup> also the students fared well. 8 students out of 12 scored above 60%. Result shows the hard work and efforts taken by students and teachers. We congratulate them on their grand success.

As we UNLOCK gradually the Covid-19 situation is becoming way of life with implementation of all precautions and norms laid down by Government.

Despite this pandemic situation Setu embarks on its journey to serve the under-served with new forays in Rajasthan in India. A new center was launched at Laliya ka Bas, Village Mahapura on the outskirts of Jaipur with the support of Metlife GOSC. It is Women Empowerment Center where ladies and

young girls will be trained on Basic Computer Skills certified by NIIT and Tailoring & Textile. Soft Launch of the Centre happened in Sept 2020 and the formal launch is slated for 21st October 2020.

In August 2020 Setu

started a formal SHG center at Jobner, Main market, Boraj Jaipur. This was Setu's first rural center in Rajasthan. The Centre is being managed by one of our beneficiary who was certified in Tailoring & Textile at the Setu Skill Centre Dhawas Jaipur. The Total footprint of Setu in Rajasthan is now at 3 locations.

"Anita is a very hardworking women and wanted to become independent. Therefore, she enrolled herself for sewing course so that she can learn basic concepts and equipment used in her profession which is important for finding a good job. After successful completion of sewing

course from SETU she works as a tailor at home and earns Rs 5000/Month.

Her Husband works in Private Sector. Her family's **annual income is Rs. 2,15,000/**-which is insufficient to fulfill the basic need of a family of 4 members. She always wants to improve her family's financial condition. So she joined

this course. Her annual family income has increased by 28%.





# Project Saksham - Empowering Women at Setu Skill centres

Skill centre continued with their online training. In this quarter 419 students enrolled in different courses. Students have started visiting the centre on rotational basis. Now classes are being conducted in blended model (online and offline).

At Setu Skill Centre for Special Needs Students an online Indian Sign Language course was launched. The objective of the course is to make it available for the community especially for the family member of Hearing Impaired person. Currently we have six enrolments in the course.

Online classes: Many students are not comfortable in visiting the centre so for them we have online classes. Trainers are coming regularly to the centre since courses like sewing, Beauty and GDA require practical demonstration.

tion.




SHG CENTER AT JAIPUR

# Shalini







Shalini

**Shalini** appeared for Class 12 CBSE Board examination in 2020. She had joined Setu in the year 2011 in class 4<sup>th</sup>. Before joining Setu she was an extremely shy girl but with the support, love and affection that she received from the teachers here in Setu made her grow day by day. Shalini is not only academically a bright student she is equally good in sports and other co- curricular activities. She has always managed to stand up as a winner in whatever activity she participated. Shalini Belongs to a family of 4 members. She lost her father in an accident at a very young age of 5. After her father's sudden demise, the financial condition of the family deteriorated. Her mother being a single parent started working as a maid in order to feed her 3 children and support their education. Her uncle also supports the family in every possible way.

When Shalini joined Setu looking at her family condition and child's eagerness towards learning made Setu decide to provide free education to Shalini till class 12. Shalini performance was outstanding in 10<sup>th</sup> CBSE Board in which she had scored 77% and in 12 CBSE Board she made every one proud by scoring 90% which is incredible.

Meet Jyoti who belongs to a lower middle class family. She wanted to learn Beauty & Wellness and support her family financially. After completing 12th she searched for a suitable job but everywhere the demand of skills let her down. So she decided to learn Beauty & Wellness skills at SETU. After completing the course she started working on her own. Now she is working with Makeover Noida, Sec 18 and earning Rs.3000/- per month.

She belongs to a family with 4 members. Her husband works in a private firm with an annual income of about Rs. I,08,000. It is difficult to meet the expenses of daily needs as well as the educational needs of two children in the family along with parents. Jyoti wanted to share her husband's responsibilities. Moreover she also wanted to be independent. Her family's annual income increased by 33%.
